## Explanation of Aerification of Greens for 2018

We started our greens aerification program some 6 years ago with the goal of getting a lot more sand in the green profile. While the program has allowed for more sand in the greens we are still behind in the amount of sand. This being said we again plan on an aggressive aerification for 2018. We will be pulling ½ inch plugs (the big holes) and inserting sand in the holes in late May which will get a good bit of sand below the surface. As well, we usually do a solid tine aerification in late July which allows the greens to breath only . This year we have decided to again pull 1/2" plugs (the big holes) in late July and insert sand. This will allow more sand in the profile and help the overall greens health.

## **New Cut of Grass**

### **for Green Banks**

You may have noticed we have a different height of grass around the greens/ green banks. We have added a  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch height of cut around green banks. This cut is seen as the first cut of rough and

You will also see the primary rough area which is cut at  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inch height which obviously is seen as Rough and

The only area where the ball may be moved is the fairway and the fringes which are all cut at  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch height.

## **Dress Code Reminder**

### **for all Members and their Guests**

While on the course, Hitting Balls on the Range or using the putting green, proper golf attire is required. No Denim of any kind and a collared shirt must be worn. While in the grill or clubhouse golf attire is encouraged but denim is acceptable, although denim is acceptable collared shirts are required.

## Pull/Push Cart Rules

We ask that all drivers of push/pull or remote carts please follow these rules for cart usage.

**#1** Pull/Push & Remote Carts are allowed past the ropes but cannot get any closer than 10 yards from any green!!

We often see carts right next to the greens edge. That is too close to protect and take care of the course.

**#2** Pull/Push & Remote Carts may never drive between a green side bunker and the greens edge!!

**#3** Push/Pull & Remote Cart users must be respectful to the golf course in their decisions where to drive carts while in use

Please follow these rules!!

It is your course, take good care of it!!

## Handicap Flag Cart Rules

We ask that all drivers of carts with Blue Handicap Flags please follow these rules for cart usage.

**#1** Carts with blue flags are allowed past the ropes but cannot get any closer than 25 yards from any green!!

**#2** Carts with blue flags may never drive behind any green!!

**#3** Carts with blue flags must be respectful to the golf course in their decisions where to drive carts while in use

**#4** Carts with blue flags must remain on the path for all Par 3's

# RULE OF THE MONTH

## Rule 24-2 Immovable Obstructions:



Interference by an immovable obstruction occurs when a ball lies in or on the obstruction, or when the obstruction interferes with the player's stance or the area of his intended swing. If the ball lies through the green, the player must lift the ball and drop it, without penalty, within one club-length of and not nearer the hole than the nearest point of relief. The nearest point of relief must not be in a hazard or on a putting green. When the ball is dropped within one club-length of the nearest point of relief, the ball must first strike a part of the course.
